Charitable: (caritativo) generous in giving to the needy.

Compass: (brújula) an instrument for finding direction.

Courtyard: (patio) an open area of ground surrounded by walls or buildings.

Fortress: (fortaleza, fuerte) a large fort or fortified town.

Fasting: (ayuno) to eat only a little kinds of food, as a religious observance.

Faith: (fe) strong belief in something.

Equal: (mismo, igual) having identical privileges, rights, status, etc.

Gambling: (apostar) to play games of chance to win Money.

Gunpowder: (pólvora) an explosive mixture.

Horseshoe: (herradura) a piece of iron shaped like a U to protect the foot of horses.

Mosque: (mezquita) a Muslim place of worship.

Pattern: (modelo) a plan or diagram.

Route: (ruta) the choice of roads taken to get to a place.

Quarter: (barrio) a district of a town or city.

Plaster: (yeso) a mixture that is applied to the surface of a wall.

Pilgrimage: (peregrinación) a journey to a sacred place.

Saffron: (azafrán) dried stigmas of a plant, used to flavour or colour food.

Sugar cane: (caña de azúcar) tall cane that has sugar inside.

To gain: (ganar, obtener) to obtain.

To inherit: (heredar) to receive a property by succession.

To pray: (rezar) to offer thanks or make a petition to a god.

Souk: (zoco) an open-air marketplace.

Water Wheel: (noría) a wheel for raising water from a river.

To reject: (rechazar) to refuse to accept.

To rear: (criar, educar) to take care for and educate the children.

To preach: (predicar) to make known a religious instruction.
