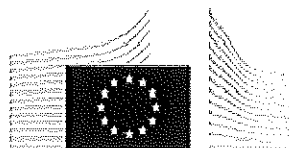

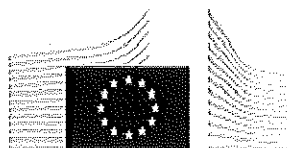

1 Nature of the tasks:

Unit B1 is responsible for developing and ensuring the consistent application of a structured surveillance framework at EU level to address macroeconomic imbalances. The unit has a varied portfolio of tasks, including the development of secondary legislation, the production of analytical work and the improvement of the analytical tools that can be used in monitoring macroeconomic imbalances, the coordination of surveillance within DG ECFIN, the cooperation with the ECOFIN Council committees (especially the Economic Policy Committee).

We are looking for a dynamic, highly motivated and analytically strong economist to join our team and to contribute to the economic analysis on issues related to macroeconomic imbalances and to the policies to address them. She or he will have a very strong background in macroeconomics (an advanced degree in economics is expected), and proven experience in the analysis of macroeconomic developments and the impact of public policies thereon. Macro-financial skills would also be considered an asset.
