

1 Nature of the tasks:

Unit B3 of the Directorate-General for Communications Networks, Content and Technology forms part of the Electronic Communications Networks and Services Directorate. This is the Directorate which runs major policy projects key to the functioning of electronic communications markets, such as the overall EU regulatory framework, the Roaming Regulation or Recommendations aiming at consistently and effectively regulating termination rates and next generation access networks. Unit B3 is entrusted with applying the Commission's oversight power in relation to national regulatory measures in all Member States. It thus ensures both the efficient development of telecommunications markets in Europe and effective cooperation between the national authorities and the Commission, to the benefit of consumers.

The national expert will, under the supervision of a Commission Official, assess draft regulatory measures proposed by national regulatory authorities, in the context of Article 7 of the Framework Directive 2002/21/EC. These measures cover in particular the definition of markets, the designation of undertakings with significant market power and remedies. He/she will contribute to the preparation of decisions to be adopted by the Commission and notified to Member States` authorities. He/she will further work in horizontal projects relating to relevant markets or regulatory remedies.

2 Main qualifications:

a) Eligibility criteria

The following eligibility criteria are to be fulfilled by the candidate in order to be seconded to the Commission. Consequently, the candidate who does not fulfil one of them will be automatically eliminated from the selection process.



1 Nature of the tasks:		
The work essentially consists in preparing the Commission's position on concentrations falling under the Merger Regulation. Case handlers deal with this task in case teams. The case handler carries out the legal and economic analysis of the impact of concentrations on the competitive structure, including market investigations and detailed discussions with the parties to the concentration and their lawyers and with suppliers, competitors and customers. Contacts are also maintained with other competition authorities. The case handler is responsible for preparing draft Commission decisions, preparing negotiations with companies and ensuring that procedures are correctly applied. The unit concerned deals with merger control in the sector of information, communication and media. The unit's staff is also called on to work in merger teams in other sectors, and possibly in antitrust case teams.

1 Nature of the tasks:

Unit COMP/H3 is responsible for the control of state aid granted by Member States in the area of direct business taxation and the sale of public assets, including urban (re)development projects. The unit deals with notifications, complaints and ex officio cases. The cases we handle are of a very varied nature and raise interesting and sometimes challenging issues of state aid policy. The unit has also a number of horizontal activities, including the preparation of the annual State Aid Watch, reporting about state aid expenditure in the EU and the Member States.

We propose a position as case handler. His/her main task will be to carry out the legal and economic assessment of public support measures in the area of taxation and real estate and prepare the corresponding Commission decisions and notes to the management and the Commissioner. 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

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

1 Nature of the tasks:

Directorate B's mission is to contribute to an improved functioning of EMU by developing, and helping apply, a framework to prevent and/or correct harmful macroeconomic imbalances. The Directorate also contributes to efforts to help EU economies exit from the economic crisis by improving growth and jobs performance in the EU. This is to be achieved by promoting growth-enhancing structural reforms at EU and national level. The Directorate also plays a leading/coordinating role to ensure that the Commission's decisions on Community policies are built on a strong economic rationale.

Unit B1 is responsible for developing and helping apply a structured framework for identifying and correcting macroeconomic imbalances, especially those which threaten the functioning of EMU. It is also working on a framework for identifying main structural policies at EU and national level that can act as drivers of growth and jobs. The unit has five main tasks. The SNE will remain employed and remunerated by his/her employer during the secondment. He/she will equally remain covered by the national social security.

Unless for cost-free SNEs, allowances may be granted by the Commission to SNEs fulfilling the conditions provided for in Art. 17 of the SNE decision.

During the secondment, SNEs are subject to confidentiality, loyalty and absence of conflict of interest obligations, as provided for in Art. 6 and 7 of the SNE Decision.

5 Processing of personal data
