Finally, the Unit has an important portfolio of international activity. We represent the EU and its Member States in copyright discussions and negotiations in the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO) and contribute to the work of other Directorate Generals as regards copyright aspects of bilateral trade agreements. In the next two years we will prepare the European Union’s ratification of the 2012 Beijing Treaty on the Protection of Audio-visual Performances and of the 2013 Marrakesh Treaty for the blind. 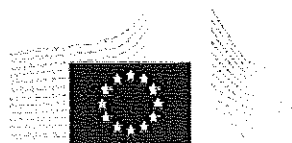

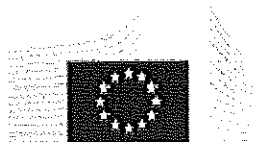

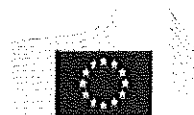
