HOW TO GET THERE

Taking the village of River Madera as our starting point, we will take the JF 7038 to the village of Venta de Rampias. Here we take the asphalted track that leads to the villages of Los Anchos and Prado Maguillo, where the start of the path is.



PARKING

There is car park at the start of the trail and there are also places nearby to leave your vehicle.

LD: LONG-DISTANCE TRAILS

The long-distance trails (LD) form a European network of marked and certified trails according to various criteria. They are generally more than 50 kilometres long or must be completed in two



days or more, but some of them cover thousands of kilometres, such as the GR-7 which links Tarifa (Cadiz) with the Greek Peloponnese.

International code for Long-Distance trails





It is completed by a network of short-distance trails (SD), which are usually between ten and fifty kilometres long. Both avoid coinciding with tarmac roads or vehicular traffic, although this may occur if there is no alternative.





This trail begins in the heart of the Sierra del Agua, known for its abundant rainfall, near the village of Los Anchos, in a place called Prado Maguillo.

We will go up the valley parallel to the Cañada stream, allowing us to enjoy the exuberant riverside vegetation, which shows all its splendour in autumn, where it stands out against the surrounding Pinus laricio vegetation. The end of the route offers impressive views of the limestone cliffs of the north of the Sierra de Segura.

Prado Maguillo

The trail is located in a remote part of the Sierra de Segura. close to the border of the province of Albacete. It is an area with a large number of

hamlets and farmhouses, with traditional architecture, scattered throughout the mountains. One of them is the village of Los Anchos, where we can visit the Alma Serrana ethnological museum. From here, the track coincides with the GR-147 path. Following it in the direction of the River Madera for about a thousand metres, we will reach a place known as Prado Maguillo (check [1] on the map).



The trail starts at this small farmhouse typical of the sierra, where we will park the vehicle. Leaving the long-distance footpath to our left and going around the houses, we

will look for a track that descends to the small valley formed by the Cañada stream, first gently descending and then ascending also gently. This track corresponds to the PR-A-199 circular path, which we will follow throughout our route.

Los Peñones Coloraos

We will pass next to a water reservoir used for irrigation, on a clavev terrain that we will go uphill. It is a idyllic scenery; the wind moves the branches of the pines and the leaves of the poplars flutter to and fro. We walk between the hill of Pinar del Saucar and Hoya Galdón following the riverside vegetation. It is spectacular to observe, in autumn, the contrast between the yellow and ochre of the gallery forest and the dark green of the hills covered with black pines.

The cliffs we see on our right, Los Peñones Coloraos [2], are inaccessible and difficult to cross. However, since ancient times, human beings have found ways to overcome these natural barriers using their ingenuity. As in the Paso de la Viga, so called because it was a large log anchored to the wall that allowed passage.



Cañada del Saucar

We reach a more open and peaceful place, where some streams meet. flowing quietly through the reeds. On the left we have a few



stone houses, which form the farmhouses of the Cañada del Saucar [3].

These buildings, which give their name to the path, are set in a not very steep valley. with *Pinus laricio* trees (black pines) in all directions. There we have a junction of forest tracks. The track on the right coincides with the PR-A-196 and goes to Puntal de la Misa, and we continue along the track on the left, following the PR-A-199, which passes over the houses we saw earlier. On our left we can see the remains of an old building and a little further on a tinada or shed, a building used for livestock farming.



The route then takes some twists and turns and arrives at a pass. At this point, there is a new junction of forest tracks, where the path ends. If we go a little further along the track on the right we will have views to the north of Monte del Espino and Calar de Morillas [4].
